



Conditions of Registration for Registered Gaming Workers in the senior gaming official class, the lottery corporation official class, and the gaming worker class.

1. Registered gaming workers must immediately report the following information to the general manager:
 - a. a change of their name,
 - b. any barring from a gaming facility imposed on the gaming worker by a gaming facility operator or a provincial prohibition from a gaming facility or PlayNow.com imposed on the gaming worker by the lottery corporation;
 - c. any barring from a horse racing facility imposed on the gaming worker by the horse racing facility operator;
 - d. a criminal investigation where the gaming worker is the subject of the investigation;
 - e. a criminal charge laid against the gaming worker; and
 - f. a civil litigation in which the gaming worker is a defendant, and there are allegations that the gaming worker was involved in fraud, theft, deceit or misrepresentation.

Conditions of Registration for Registered Gaming Workers in the senior gaming official class and the gaming worker class who work at a Provincial Gaming Facility.

Gaming Worker Identification Cards

1. Registered gaming workers who work at a gaming facility must display their gaming worker identification card issued by the gaming facility or the Independent Gambling Control Office in a manner that is clearly visible to the public while on duty at a gaming facility unless they are engaged to conduct security or surveillance at the facility.
2. Registered gaming workers who are engaged to conduct security and surveillance at a gaming facility must carry their gaming worker identification card issued by the gaming facility or the Independent

Gambling Control Office and produce the card on request of any of the following:

- The general manager, an auditor, inspector, or investigator of the Independent Gambling Control Office;
- An investigator of the lottery corporation; or
- a police officer.

Participation in a Lottery Scheme

3. Registered gaming workers must not participate in a lottery scheme operated at a gaming facility that is owned, operated, or managed by a gaming service provider where the registered gaming worker is employed.

Gaming Worker Training

4. Registered gaming workers who are employed at a gaming facility, other than supervisors of registered gaming workers, must complete the problem gambling course offered by the lottery corporation under s. 3(1)(b) of the Lottery Corporation Training Program Regulation within 30 days of their employment start date and every two years thereafter.
5. Registered gaming workers that are:
 - a. retained to carry out security services;
 - b. employed as security guards; or
 - c. employed as supervisors of registered gaming workers

at the gaming facility, must complete the problem gambling course offered by the lottery corporation under s.3(1)(c) of the Lottery Corporation Training Program Regulation within 90 days of their employment start date or the date they begin providing security services and every two years thereafter.

6. Registered gaming workers employed at a gaming facility as a security guard or engaged to carry out security services and whose duties include assisting individuals to enrol in the voluntary self-exclusion program must complete the patron resource course offered by the lottery corporation



under s.4 of the Lottery Corporation Training Program Regulation within 90 days of their employment start date and every two years thereafter.

7. Registered gaming workers employed at the facility who:
 - a. interact with participants in provincial gaming schemes,
 - b. monitor financial transactions between the operator and participants or review records of those transactions;
 - c. handle funds received for the purpose of buying in within the meaning of s. 38 of the Gaming Control Act; or
 - d. oversee the operator's compliance with Division 4 [*Measures to Prevent Unlawful Activities by Participants in Provincial Gaming Schemes*] of Part 4 [*General Prohibitions, Duties and Powers Respecting Lottery Schemes*] of the Act

must complete the anti-money laundering course offered by the lottery corporation under s.5 of the Lottery Corporation Training Program Regulation prior to engaging in the activities specified above in "a" through "d" and each year thereafter.
8. Registered gaming workers employed at a gaming facility who engage in surveillance, or who supervise registered gaming workers engaged in surveillance at the facility, must complete the surveillance course offered by the lottery corporation under s.6(1) of the Lottery Corporation Training Program regulation within 180 days of their employment start date.
