
Conditions of Registration for Registered Gaming Workers (Including Lottery Contract Managers)

1. Registered gaming workers must immediately report the following information to the general manager:
 - a. a change of their name,
 - b. any barring from a gaming facility imposed on the gaming worker by a gaming facility operator or a provincial prohibition from a gaming facility or PlayNow.com imposed on the gaming worker by the lottery corporation;
 - c. any barring from a horse racing facility imposed on the gaming worker by the horse racing facility operator;
 - d. a criminal investigation where the gaming worker is the subject of the investigation;
 - e. a criminal charge laid against the gaming worker; and
 - f. a civil litigation in which the gaming worker is a defendant, and there are allegations that the gaming worker was involved in fraud, theft, deceit or misrepresentation.

Conditions of Registration for Registered Gaming Services Providers in the Gaming Retailer Class

1. The gaming retailer must designate an employee as the “lottery contract manager” to have managerial responsibility for the sale of lottery tickets at the gaming retail site(s) operated by the gaming retailer.
2. A copy of the gaming retailer’s site certificate(s) issued by the Independent Gambling Control Office at the time of registration or renewal must be posted in public view at each retail site operated by the gaming retailer.
3. At the demand of the general manager, the gaming retailer must report to the general manager if any of the following occur:
 - a) the gaming retailer ends the designation of the employee as the lottery contract manager;

- b) the designated lottery contract manager is no longer employed by the gaming retailer;
 - c) the designated lottery contract manager is reassigned to retail sites other than those for which their registration applies;
 - d) the designated lottery contract manager individual is unable to fulfill managerial responsibility for a retail site to which their registration applies.
4. The gaming retailer must immediately report to the general manager any civil litigation, criminal or regulatory investigation or other legal proceeding involving the gaming retailer, where there are allegations of theft, fraud, or another serious offence that would have a material impact on the gaming retailer's fitness to hold a registration, whether commenced by the gaming retailer or by another person and whether in British Columbia or another jurisdiction.
5. The gaming retailer must report to the general manager a suspension, cancellation or refusal of licensing, registration or renewal, in another jurisdiction, of the gaming retailer.
6. The gaming retailer must immediately report to the general manager any change in the gaming retailers' name, business address, or mailing address.
7. The gaming retailer must ensure that employees of the gaming retailer whose job duties include the sale of lottery tickets at its gaming retailer sites complete the lottery ticket course offered by the lottery corporation under s.2(1) of the Lottery Corporation Training Program Regulation within 60 days of their employment start date.
